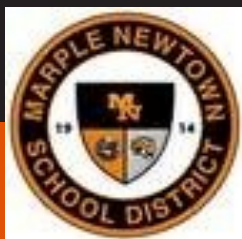

Dual Enrollment

A maximum of six (6) courses may be counted toward the requirements for a student's high school graduation.

Covid Response

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, MNHS moved to a distance learning format starting March 13, 2020 and extending to the end of the 2019-2020 school year. Students were required to continue their learning with fidelity through participation in both synchronous and asynchronous instruction. Homework, assessments, and exams were assigned and number grades were issued for all students. Final exams were not given in any classes.

The 2020-2021 school year started with virtual learning for all students and transitioned to a hybrid model in October 2020 until March 15th where all students had the opportunity for full time, in-person instruction. Students also had the option of a fully virtual format until the end of the school year. Our grading scale, grading policies, and academic calendar have NOT changed due to any changes in the format of instruction.

Calculation of GPA

Grade point average is determined on a 4.0 scale with slight weight given to higher level courses. Honors courses receive 0.3 weight and AP courses receive 0.7 weight. All courses count towards GPA. MNHS does not rank our students.

Continuing Education

Approximately 84% of MNHS graduates continue onto a program of higher education. Approximately 75% of MNHS graduating classes enroll in a 4-year college and 9% enroll in a 2-year college. The 16% who do not attend a higher education institution enroll in the military, participate in a gap year, or are employed.
